





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#### "HERITAGE" IS A VALUE-LABEL, ADDED IN INTERACTION.



#### ITEMS VALUED AS "HERITAGE" ARE NOT PER SE:

- Something which should be kept (who decides?)
- Something which society wants to keep (who is society?)
- Something we want to keep (who is 'we'?)
- Something Europe wants to keep (who is Europe?)



# a. Ethnographic Fieldwork


Exploring the site via communicating with people and recording sights, sounds, smells, etc




# b. Emotion Networking

Emotion Networking Methodology (Reinwardt Academy and Imagine IC)

- Network visualisation of emotional responses (positive, negative, weak, strong)
- Emotions and 'waste'






















# c. Living Archive



Accessible audiovisual information that shows past, present and imagined futures of the historic sites.

The sites' Living Archive can become a rich, multi-faceted and multi-vocal reminder of many different good, but also painful memories, experiences, usages, and traces of the past.

# CONTEXT








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- Historic industrial area
- Great diversity in buildings, residents and businesses
- Attracts creatives and entrepreneurs due to lower prices and fewer restrictions
- Attracts developers who want to convert or demolish the old industrial and residential buildings and build housing

# FUGLEREDEN

- Historic building from 1885 and one of the last classic Danish Brown Bars in the pilot area
- To be demolished and redeveloped for housing
- Citizen and local political mobilization
- Demolition stopped by City Council in 2020
- Have led to new zoning in pilot area
- Heritage: Cultural, industrial

# A 'CONSERVING' ZONING PLAN FOR NORDVEST

Goal: To conserve existing buildings and urban environments of cultural or architectural value

Also: Seen as a possible new model for other areas in Copenhagen where creative ecosystems are endangered

Exploring the value of CENTRINNO as part of zoning

- In the specific pilot case
- In a wider Copenhagen context






# EN session in Nordvest

#### Context:

- New 'conserving' zoning plan for the pilot site had to be developed.
- Pointing out buildings that are worth preserving.
- Typically, less including process with only few possibilities for citizens to give input.
- Can EN be used as a tool to democratize the development of 'conserving' zoning plans?



### Testing the EN method

- DDC joined a meeting for citizens in Nordvest hosted by the municipality.
- Tested a shortened format of EN appropriate for the program of the meeting.
- Smaller groups of citizens discussing their feelings towards a building identified on a list of buildings possibly worth preserving.

### Learnings:

- Really good to initiate conversations on local identity
- Created common awareness on heritage and local identity
- Identified wish to highlight heritage



### Output

- Further exploration of opportunities for adding the method to the toolbox for citizen/actor involvement
- Proactive tools
- Potential collaboration with the municipality's local committees (lokaludvalg)
- Highlighting local heritage and increase awareness
- Challenges:
- Changing existing practices
- Creating ambassadors training the trainers





### Further development & outcome

- Identifying who could adopt the method
- Testing the method with the municipality's local committees
- Iterating and formalizing the method
- Producing EN kit (introduction and train the trainer)
- The finalized conserving zoning plan for Nordvest:
- Preservation of 98 buildings 36 with industrial heritage



# ETHNOGRAFIC FIELDWORK & LIVING ARCHIVE

### Collecting stories for the Living Archive

- Understanding people living and/or working in the area (different views)
- Talking to a broad spectrum of different stakeholders with different identities, values and mindsets.
- Understanding and exploring the stakeholder's historical awareness, their relationship to the area and their role in the community.





### Activating local students

- Interviewing students at the local vocational school NEXT
- Creating exhibition of photos and stories with students about crafts and creative subjects
- Visualizing the presence of craft in the neighborhood today




### Activating locals in a Podwalk

- Conversations with 20 different people who either live, work or study in the area
- A historian, an architect, a café owner, a priest, a school student, a poet, an activist, a writer, a brewer and many others
- What they all have in common is a love or curiosity for the raw, the quirky and the possibilities in the old industrial neighborhood
- The stories are linked to specific places and take you on a tour of the entire neighborhood

### Co-creating a Local Archive


Bydelsdag (Neighborhood day)

- Collecting input from residents and visitors at the local Bydelsdag
- · Collecting input about the area's identity and soul
- Visualising local perspectives



### Exhibition of the Local Archive

- Exhibition at the local Library focusing on the industrial heritage and present and future identity of the area
- Stories collected from local business, teachers at the maker space, entrepreneurs, developers, local historians, cultural institutions and residents
- Format/concept is under development
- Goal is to use already collected material and make it interactive (keep adding to the local archive)



### Heritage bicycle route

- Launching a bicycle route for residents,
   Copenhageners and tourists that conveys the industrial and cultural heritage of the area
- Goal: to strengthen people's awareness and knowledge of the city's cultural and industrial heritage
- Part of World Capital of Architecture




# CENTRINNO - IN A WIDER COPENHAGEN CONTEXT



### Focus on industrial heritage

- Increased focus on dissemination of cultural and industrial heritage in the city in general.
- Increased focus on heritage through the preservation of distinctive buildings and urban environments.
- Increased focus on ensuring the right framework for small creative and craft business in the development of former industrial areas.


