9 PILOT CITIES

Pilot cities will follow unique strategies, aligned with pilot size and theme, towards a common approach to mission-driven innovation and multi-scalar strategy.

Through action research at the neighbourhood level the nine pilot cities will each connect to local traditions of the industrial revolution such as wool, textiles, leather or food.





WHAT MAKES CENTRINNO UNIQUE?




An innovative, inclusive approach



A global network of 38 cities




Why use the Fab City Hub Toolkit?

- Be inspired and connect with a community of FCH engaged in the challenge of making city sustainable productive and inclusive


